## Babergh & Mid Suffolk

- 600 square miles
- 18% tree coverage
  - 53000 tonnes removed
  - 1.3m tonnes stored
  - 5m cubic metres rainwater drained
- 900 hectares existing accessible open space
- 233 hectares amenity green space
- 119 hectares churchyard/cemetery green space
- **2030** net zero aim
- 1140 council owned assets with book value £45m
- 880 of which are categorised countryside/open space


## Strategic Context

- Carbon Reduction Plan adopted August 2020 & Biodiversity Action Plan adopted January 2021

- What is the potential to enhance these sites and enhance BNG






